The Orchestre International du Vetex was formed in 2004 in the small Flemish town of Kortrijk for a special occasion: the aim was to gather professional and amateur musicians from Flanders, Wallonia and the North of France in order to publicize the wish to renovate the old textile factory Vetex located in an deserted part of the city. Some local associations took part in the project and a couple of weeks later, the Orchestre International du Vetex gave its first concert at the "Fiesta Mestiza"-festival in Kortrijk.

This moment is the beginning of a great adventure. The band is quickly noticed in the musical world in Belgium thanks to its crazy mixture of brassmusic, always dotted with a punky rock'n'roll attitude. It shows energy everywhere it goes, but not only because of the style or the numerous musicians, also because those ones don't like to be too serious and certainly want to have fun with the audience. It's a cross-border band, with people from three different regions in two different countries but they all share the same values and fight for the same ideas. Fascinating? Of course. Easy? Not always...

In 2005, after several concerts in Belgium and France, the Orchestre International du Vetex recorded its first album, "Le Beau Bazar", a CD and a DVD with 12 songs and a documentary about the life of this cross-border band. Then, they recorded "Flamoek Fantasy" in 2007. Both albums received very good critics in Belgium but also in other European countries.

Until now, the Vetex played more than 500 concerts... From little clubs and parties to big and famous stages... From the streets of Sarajevo to the underground in Praha. From the Olympic Games in Turin to prestigious street and world music festivals in Graz, Jelenia Gora, Nis, Santander, Amsterdam, Bansko, Berlin, Montréal, Budapest...

In 2008 and 2009, the band headed more and more east-wards, spending a lot of time touring through the Balkans (Serbia, Bosnia-Herzegovina and Bulgaria). They did it for the pleasure of touring, they did it because they are a cross-border band, but also because Balkan music had always been a big inspiring influence for the band. During this travelling and tours, they started a friendship and a musical collaboration with musicians from these regions such as the great Serbian accordion-player Ivo Vucelja, the young talented Bosnian trumpet player Ivan Sucac and the phenomenal female singer from Mostar, Jelena Milusic. Soon, they started to work on a new project: they created a show where both the music of the Vetex and traditional songs of the Balkans are played. Moreover, Adela Jusic, a young artist-filmmaker that survived the war in the surrounded city of Sarajevo, gave us a very personal view of the life near the borders and the way to live with our neighbours despite our differences through images and videos. And here is the result: an international production called 'Balkan Banquets'. A fascinating show with a lot of joy but with sadness and nostalgia too. A show that makes us think about the borders, here and there. Physical and psychological borders. Musical and geographical ones...

On the 5th of November 2009, the Orchestre International du Vetex presented "Balkan Banquets" at Kortrijk's City Theater. This concert was recorded and filmed in order to be broadcasted on a Walloon TV, "No Télé", but also in order to be part of a DVD box "Mix Grill" which was going to be released in june 2010.

Spring 2011 the Orchestre will present a brand new album, already its third one, and will be on the road again all over Europe and abroad.



Full Instrumentation:

The « Orchestre international du Vetex » is a band that can either play acoustic (street gigs) or amplified on stage.

The band is made up of: 2 or 3 trombones, 3 or 4 trumpets, 2 tubas, 1 baritone saxophone; 1 alto saxophone, 1 bass drum, 1 snare, 1 percussion, 1 clarinet and 1 accordion. Some small modifications are possible depending on specific conditions.

"Le Beau Bazar" (2005). This album has been recorded at the Maison Folie of Lille Moulins. It is a kind of bizarre French-Flemish mixture of catchy balkanmusic, energetic gypsie and streetmusic, ska, polka, java, latino... But beside the up-tempo extravert themes, the album also offers space for some more intimist and silent songs (like Licht a.u.b. = Light please). The DVD 'Les Beaux Temps' then again is like a little road-movie from the 'Vetex on the road'.

CROSS-BORDER BRASS

The Orchestre International du Vetex is one of no fewer than 20 brass bands EN that will be along to inaugurate the brand new Flagey square. You can see them onstage, too, in the evening. What began back in 2004 as a praiseworthy socio-artistic project has become a musical force over the last few years. "We are ready, as a brass band, to appear on a stage and to go to the Balkans too!"



Vetex emerged in 2004 as a socio-artistic project in the Kortrijk-Tournai-Lille region. The idea was to work across the language frontier between Kortrijk (in Flanders) and Tournai (in Wallonia) and across the national border with the northern French city of Lille. "The social project was meant to last three months, but it got completely out of hand, as we're still in existence!", laughs Ruben Deprez, trombonist and frontman/driving force behind the ensemble. The regional cooperation project dates from before the establishment of the communauté urbaine that now fosters cooperation between the three cities. "Genuine cooperation across language and national borders is possible, because culture knows no borders. None of us knew each other when we started off; now, four years on, we rehearse every week and play about 100 live gigs a year. There is no better way to develop better understanding. And it has caught on with audiences too. We get very favourable reactions to our cross-(language-)border work."

Under the bridge

Most of the tracks on their second album. Flamoek Fantasy, were written by Thomas Morzewski. But the album goes well beyond the Balkan clichés that so many brass bands settle for. There is Yiddish music, for example, on "Klezmer Amer", two Italian tarantellas ("La Fiduciosa" and "La Dottoressa"), and some Latino influences on "Vetex Mex". And what great titles! The likes of "Funky Wallouks" or "Flamoek Fantasy", an anthem in praise of openness.

The album has been criticised for musical shortcomings. "It's true that we are more of a live group; we rely on our energy and exuberance onstage. Don't forget that we started from nothing and that of the 19 musicians only nine are professional musicians. The others are volunteers who have learned as they went along. Our performances are our school. We get asked more and more to appear onstage, so we are paying more attention these days to the musical side of things: That fits in fine with the socio-artistic project: bringing these people to a higher level," says Deprez, who, as well as being a musician, is also a social-artistic worker. A number of the musicians have some kind of "social" link: people who, thanks to this project, have had opportunities to develop artistically and improve themselves. Last week Vetex were at Couleur Café as a brass band and the band also played dur-

ing the Balkan Trafik festival. "They were so enthusiastic there that we can go back next year with our new project with Serbian musicians. In March I went to Serbia with Thomas Morzewski and squeezebox-player Jean Baptiste Lison to lay the groundwork for a new project. We have adapted seven traditional Serbian and Macedonian pieces. Next year we will present that project at Balkan Trafik and that will be followed by a theatre tour. We're thinking of recording our third album live, because it's onstage that we're at our best. This summer we're off, the whole group, to Serbia and Macedonia to play there, under the bridge at Mostar, among other things. Really exciting. Those people went through terrible things during the war. We'll try to cheer them up with our energy and our pleasure in playing." (B7)
